Title: Thurman Collection

Summary/Abstract: Letters, newspaper clippings, photographs, scrapbooks, and memorabilia documenting the early life and family of James Collins Thurman, III, of Nashville.

Scope and Contents of the Collection:

Letters, photographs, newspaper clippings and other materials documenting the social life and high school athletic career of James Collins Thurman III, as well as photographs and other materials documenting the lives of his parents, grandparents, and great-grandmother; James Collins Thurman, Jr. and Kathryn Shaw Parrish, William McMurray Parrish and Ethel McVitty, and Kathryn Giers McVitty Shaw.

Biographical/Personal Sketch:

James Collins Thurman, III (Jim), was born in Nashville, Tennessee, on April 14, 1939. Kathryn Shaw Parrish Thurman, his mother, was a Nashville native, born at Barr's Infirmary on March 8, 1909. After receiving her education at Ward-Belmont School, Kathryn worked as a dancing teacher and volunteered for the American Red Cross. She married a Navy veteran and Chattanooga, James Collins Thurman, Jr., in June 1933.

Kathryn's parents, William McMurray Parrish and Ethel McVitty Parrish, were also Nashville natives. Born on March 18, 1887, William Parrish started as a clerk for the Keith-Simmons Company, and worked his way up to company director. Ethel was born on June 13, 1885; the second child of Kathryn Giers McVitty Shaw and Frank Dow McVitty. They were married on August 20, 1906, in Chicago, Illinois. Karl, her older brother, was born on February 27, 1883.

Jim's great-grandmother, Kathryn Giers McVitty Shaw, was born in Nashville on February 2, 1864. Kathryn and her older brother Otto were orphaned as children when their parents, Peter and Barbara Burchartz, died between 1868 and 1870. The Burchartz family had ties to the German community in Nashville, and the two children were adopted by Carl and Pauline Giers. Carl, born in Germany in April 1828, was a photographer and opened a photography business in Nashville about 1852. His wife Pauline was born in Stuttgart, Germany in 1825 and immigrated to the United States in 1845, the same year as Carl. The two were married in St. Louis, Missouri, on November 13, 1846. Carl died on May 24, 1877, and is buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery. Pauline Giers died on March 15, 1895, and is also buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery with her husband, but there no marker. Carl's adopted son Otto worked with his father at their photography studio and later took over the business.

In 1881, Kathryn Giers McVitty Shaw married Frank McVitty, an Ohio native, in Nashville. Sometime around 1900, the couple either separated or divorced, and Kathryn married Clark A. Shaw and possibly moved to Chicago with Shaw. She died on February 9, 1918. It is unknown where or when Frank McVitty lived after separating from Kathryn, but he died on December 21, 1919, and is buried in Elmwood Cemetery in Memphis.

Karl, Kathryn and Frank McVitty's eldest child, worked for the State Department, and died in 1959. Their daughter, Ethel McVitty Parrish, died on March 21, 1948, with Amorphic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) listed as the cause on her death certificate. Her husband, William McMurray Parrish, died on April 20, 1951. Their daughter Kathryn Shaw Parrish Thurman died in December of 1980; the exact date is unknown.
